The petition of Frank Arena hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:
First. My place of residence is 1620 St 9th St Boston Mass.
Second. My occupation is Gen H Corp #41
Third. I was born on the 11 day of April, anno Domini 1899, at Massena
Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Massena on or about the 5 day of June
anno Domini 1899, and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York, on the VI day of June
anno Domini 1899 on the vessel Home de Lancy
(If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given.)
Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 11 day of June, anno Domini 1899
at Massena, in the Massena Court of Massena
Sixth. I am not married. My wife's name is None; she was born on the None day of None, anno Domini 18None
at None, and now resides at None (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)
I have None children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Emperor of China of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.
Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the VI day of June, anno Domini 1899, and in the State of Massena continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 11 day of June, anno Domini 1899, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the Massena Court of Massena at Massena on the 11 day of June, anno Domini 1899, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit None, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.

OATH OF ALLEGIANCE

I hereby declare, on oath, that I absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Victor Emmanuel III of King of Italy of whom I have heretofore been a subject; that I will support and defend the Constitution and laws of the United States of America against all enemies, foreign and domestic; and that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same.
